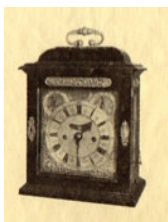

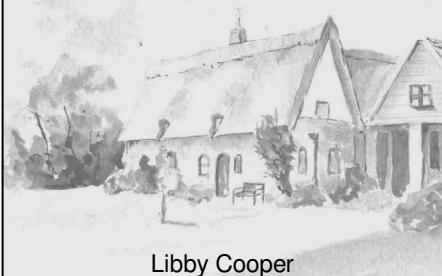

I write this as the breaking news on the television is that the vote to allow the legislation to proceed towards women becoming bishops in the Church of England has been lost. The General Synod, the governing body of the Church of England has been meeting in London and after a final debate, the vote was taken this evening (20th November). The Measure needed a two thirds majority in the House of Bishops, the House of Clergy and the House of Laity. It did not obtain the required majority in the House of Laity and was therefore lost, by 1% of the majority needed. There is great sadness within the church that this has happened especially as it will now be several years before the matter can come back to the Synod. The church has certainly lost some credibility when its governing body does not follow the view expressed by the majority of those around the country as indicated by acceptance from 42 of the 44 Dioceses.

Suffolk's Bishop Nigel said: "Overall there is a clear majority within the Church of England who want women to become Bishops. "I know that in our diocese of St Edmundsbury and Ipswich there will be widespread disappointment. Our diocesan synod voted in support and all diocesan synod representatives at General Synod voted in favour of women bishops. "This is very sad for the vast majority of the Church who had hoped that this development would go through. "I would like to reassure women clergy that despite their disappointment this is no reflection on their much valued ministry, which continues to be hugely valued and appreciated. "We have to wait and see what happens now. Most of those opposed recognise that the vast majority of the Church of England wants progress on this and they professed that they would be willing to help to secure a way forward. "I

hope this turns out to be true and some constructive meetings can happen sooner rather than later. The whole debate was very long and every possible position on the matter was aired."

Please will you pray for those who feel so let down by the system, for the unity of the Church of England and wider Anglican Communion and most importantly for Bishop Justin Welby who is to take over the leadership of the church as 105th Archbishop of Canterbury in March 2013.

Meanwhile some local good news. **THE CARLFORD GROUP** of which Great & Little Bealings, Playford and Culpho form a part comes into being officially on January 1st 2013. We have been working towards this for about 2 years and already the Bealings benefice has been working with the parishes and ministry teams from the benefices of Otley and Grundisburgh, sharing resources such as a Lent course and Wedding preparation afternoon, and providing clergy holiday cover for each other.

Although we are part of the group, Bealings, Playford & Culpho are the parishes least affected by the change, we stay independent, as four parishes with a half time clergy post, but we have agreed to try and work together even more than at present. The parishes who will notice the greatest change are the four who form the benefice of Otley. Canon Graham Hedger is returning to full time work with the Diocese and therefore resigning as half time priest of the benefice. Canon Clare Sanders will assume overall responsibility for the parishes of Otley, Clopton, Swiland and Ashbocking making her total eight parishes to be known as the new Carlford Benefice. This is not to say that she will be doing everything herself. We are very fortunate in the twelve parishes of the group, as we have 2 Stipendiary

priests, 2 Associate priests, 1 newly ordained priest still in training, 1 Reader, 1 Reader in training and 1 Ordinand (priest in training) There are also several priests who are willing to help out on an occasional basis. The way we work is changing but I believe for the better. We are working together, sharing ideas, training and supporting each other. I believe that is more in line with the way Jesus taught his disciples. They were a group with different skills who often worked in different geographical areas, Peter with the Jewish people in Jerusalem and Paul with the non Jews in the Greek areas. Sometimes they came together, sometimes they visited

one another. It sounds as if it is a pattern that will work in our parishes, giving more flexibility overall. Do be assured though, that I remain your parish priest and our Elders remain attached to our villages. If you require a chat or a visit please contact me or one of the Elders, details are in the front of this benefice newsletter.

Details of our Christmas Services are in the centre pullout pages of this newsletter and I hope that we will see you at one or other of them. Meanwhile may we take this opportunity to wish you a Holy Christmas and peaceful New Year.

ASH DIEBACK DISEASE

**What will be rising from the ashes?
The Parish Councils have received
this information from the Country-
side Officer at SCDC**

Ash dieback is a serious disease affecting Northern Europe and it seems that it is here to stay.

The UK currently has 80 million ash trees. On account of the loosely branched structure of the trees, plenty of light reaches the woodland floor allowing a variety of plants to grow beneath them providing an invaluable source of food and shelter to a wide

range of wildlife, mostly birds and insects, many of which are already under threat.

Ash trees were first recorded dying in large numbers from what is now believed to be this newly identified form of ash dieback in Poland in 1992. In February 2012 the disease was found in a consignment of infected trees sent from a nursery in the Netherlands to a nursery in Buckinghamshire, England. Since then it has been found in a number and variety of locations in Great Britain, all these sites had received stocks of young ash plants from nurseries within the past five years. Further cases have also been confirmed in the nursery trade.

In October 2012, scientists confirmed a small number of cases in East Anglia in ash trees at sites in the wider natural environment, including established older woodland, which do not appear to have any association with recently supplied nursery stock. Further similar findings were confirmed in Kent, Essex and other counties in early November 2012. The disease may have been carried on the wind or on birds coming across the North Sea, or on items such as footwear, clothing or vehicles of people who had been in infected sites in Continental Europe.

On Friday November 16th the first cases were confirmed in Northern Ireland and as ash makes up nearly 50% of the tree population here, the consequences will be devastating.

Ash dieback is caused by a fungus *Chalarafraxinea* and is being treated as a quarantine pest under national emergency measures, and it is important that suspected cases of the disease are reported.

In the winter months when trees naturally lose their leaves the disease can be even harder to detect. Trees with withered tops and shoots are very characteristic, small lens shaped lesions appear on the bark of stems causing

wilting and dieback of shoots and branches particularly in the upper crown, underneath the bark lesions the wood has a brownish grey discolouration. Leaves, when they are visible suffer from wilting and a black-brownish discolouration at the leaf base and midrib. Mature trees lose any new growth.

The Forestry commission website has a very useful pictorial guide for anyone struggling to identify the symptoms.

If you think you may have discovered a case of the disease then please contact the Chalara helpline: 08459 33 55 77 (open 8am - 6pm every day) or the Forestry Commission Plant Health Service - plant.health@forestry.gsi.gov.uk. DO NOT take any samples away with you, make a note of the exact location and report your findings immediately.

REPORT BY COUNTY COUNCILLOR PETER BELLFIELD

REPORT BY POLICE

PCSO Sally Thomas reported that there has been 1 crime in Great Bealings – an egg thrown at a window breaking the pane of glass. Speeding along Martlesham Road is still a top priority. Councillors asked if Boot Street could also be marked up as a “top priority”. The police were asked to get in touch with Martin Cripps and Paul Norris to revisit Boot Street. Paul Norris reported that he has previously given permission for the police to use his driveway as a suitable location to pull speeding cars over. Councillors were disappointed that the “natural” speed restriction – the “hump” in the Boot Street bridge has been removed. Cars that were once pushed to do 25mph now do over 45 mph! Councillors felt very strongly that the hump should be re-instated and asked District Councillor Tony Fryatt to write to the Highways Department stating this.

NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN – Progress Report

The Public meeting is scheduled for the 7th Dec (see flyer) with a pre-meeting informal chat at The Lodge on Wed, 28th November at 18:30pm.

PLANNING APPLICATIONS:

Applicants for both properties were present to answer questions.

Bridge House, Lodge Road, Great Bealings, Woodbridge, IP13 6NW

Single Storey Rear Extension.

It was resolved to support this application

1 & 2 Wood Barn Cottages, Seckford Hall Rd, IP13 6NX

Demolition of Nos 1 & 2 Wood Barn Cottages and a redundant agricultural building together with the erection of two No. replacement dwellings and cartlodes and associated private drainage system.

It was resolved to object on the grounds that;

- the planning application is not completely within the existing residential curtilage – contrary to Policy.

- We are not convinced that the replacement is on a like for like bases - the proposed replacement dwellings are the same floor space as existing dwellings + permitted development rights however the cart lodges are in addition to this.

- The new ridge height is significantly higher at 9.2 metres.

- If planning permission was granted it would set an unfortunate precedent for the replacement of the adjoining agricultural barns to new dwellings.

EAST ANGLIA ONE WIND FARM

EAOW put their plans in to the Planning Inspectorate on the 19th November. We then have 4 weeks to decide whether we were consulted properly. Whether we were consulted properly about the increase of traffic on the roads was discussed. It was resolved to support that the joint letter from Little Bealings, Playford, Great Bealings and Grundisburgh be sent to EAOW subject to the removal of the final paragraph. Julian Haywood Smith said he would represent Great Bealings Parish Council at the next meeting hosted by Little Bealings Parish Council.

HIGHWAYS

Hasketon Road – Mrs Nesling's letters regarding the volume, speed and suitability of vehicles using this road were noted. A site visit is due from the Area

Engineer – Tony Buckingham. A Councillor will also attend.

FINANCE

Cheques were written for the clerk's salary, CWT expenses and insurance for the village sign.

The draft budget was reviewed. This will be finalised at the January meeting.

LITTLE BEALINGS PARISH COUNCIL

Notes of the Parish Council Meeting held on 12 November 2012

Mrs Toni Cornish was welcomed to her first meeting as a Parish Councillor.

PLANNING

C12/2189: The Orchard, Holly Lane: Variation of Condition of retention of dwelling without compliance with Condition 2 of Planning Permission C12/0571 seeking

the variation of this condition to remove Class E from the restriction, allowing householder permitted development rights to be reinstated for developments falling within Class E of the Town & Country General Permitted Development Order (2008) for (outbuildings, enclosures and pools)

The Council resolved to object to this application.

C/12/1806 10 Holly Close – Erection of First Floor Rear Extension

SCDC had refused this application.

C11/2768 Land Adjacent to Wychwood, Martlesham Road – Erection of one dwelling and garage together with construction of new vehicular access

The appeal against SCDC's refusal of the application had been rejected by the Planning Inspectorate.

C12/2214: Demolition of Nos. 1&2 Wood Barn Cottages and a redundant agricultural building together with the erection of two No. replacement dwellings and cart-ldges and associated private drainage system. (Gt Bealings)

The Council resolved to object to the application as it constituted new housing in the countryside and could set a precedent.

LIGHTING FROM KESGRAVE SCHOOL MULTI-USE GAMES AREA

It was agreed to write and draw the School's attention to the light spillage from the floodlights, and ask if mitigating action could be taken to lessen the impact on a nearby property.

EAST ANGLIAN OFFSHORE WIND-FARM

A joint meeting of representatives from Lt Bealings, Gt Bealings, Playford and Grundisburgh & Culpho Parish Councils, with District Councillor Tony Fryatt, had taken place to discuss the Council's strong objection to the route of the cable through Lt Bealings, including across Lodge Road and Holly Lane, and the impact of the proposed construction depot at Playford. It was agreed to sign a joint letter objecting to the development, in view of the impact on the com-

munities of the cabling route and the construction depot. A further meeting would be held with the other Councils and SCDC in December, with a view to pursuing a joint objection with the Planning Inspectorate.

NEIGHBOURHOOD PLANNING

No issues had been raised by residents concerning any environmental, social or economic issue which could be included in a Neighbourhood Plan, and there was no area of the parish to be considered for development. Moreover Suffolk ACRE had confirmed its advice that Neighbourhood Plans cannot be protectionist, but are positive documents to promote development. All development needed to comply with national and local planning legislation and policy, which could not be further restricted by a Neighbourhood Plan. It was therefore decided not to prepare a Plan, but to consider a Village Review of the Parish Plan at the Annual Parish Meeting next year. An update of the Council's Planning Statement would also take place once the LDF had been finalised.

POLICE

No police officer was available to attend but a report had been sent. A shed had been burgled in The Street.

CLOSURE OF THE ADMIRAL'S HEAD PUBLIC HOUSE

The Council would contact SCDC about the condition of the site, and nominate the building as a Community Asset. This would enable the community to bid for the property if it was put on the market.

HIGHWAYS

SCC had repaired the gate to the playing field path and George Ball had carried out extra cutting to clear the footbridge at Grove Farm. Flooding in Lodge Road had been reported to SCC.

PLANTING AT SINKS PIT

SCC had not agreed to extend the area of tree planting at Sinks Pit beyond the

strip adjoining Hall Road. It was therefore decided not to pursue a licence for tree planting at the site any further.

FINANCE

The second half of the precept, £3,000, had been received from SCDC and £172 from SCC for footpath cutting. A cheque was signed for the external auditor's fee of £144. The budget for 2013/14 was agreed, with no increase in the precept.

PARISH COUNCILLOR TRAINING

Mrs Cornish would attend SALC training in December.

CHRIS PENN 1937 - 2012

Chris lived in Playford for the best part of 50 years, renting Cobblers in Hill Farm Road when he first arrived before buying the orchard from Col. Airy in the early 1970s where he built Cherry Bank. He was born in Kensington and went to Sherborne School in Dorset; he did his National Service in the Royal Navy and took part in the Suez debacle of 1956. Through family connections he found employment with a firm of Ipswich timber importers but for most of his working life he managed companies manufacturing agricultural buildings, the barn at the top of Church Hill being just one example of the work he did across the region. His life in local politics began in the Ipswich Young Conservatives where he soon rose to be Chairman. From there he was elected an Ipswich Borough Councillor for the Bixley ward in 1965 later becoming Conservative leader but, through a change in jobs when he no longer worked in the Borough, he did not seek re-election in 1976.

The following year he was elected a Suffolk County Councillor for what was to become Kesgrave and Martlesham, winning a further five elections there before retiring in 2001. He became Leader of the Council from 1986 to 1993, Leader of the Conservative Group from 1986 to 1997 and Vice-Chairman of Suffolk County Council from 1992 to 1993. During those 24 years he served on countless committees and represented the Council on numerous outside bodies. Between 2000 and 2001 he was chairman of Suffolk Police Authority. He was awarded the OBE in recognition of his public service.

He leaves a widow, Maureen, three sons, Jonathan, William and Edward and three stepdaughters, Susan, Carole and Julie as well as many grandchildren. His funeral took place in Playford church on 9 October.
